#### Disclosures:

MSCI ACWI Index captures large and mid cap representation across 23 Developed Markets (DM) and 23 Emerging Markets (EM) countries. With 2,469 constituents, the index covers approximately 85% of the global investable equity opportunity set. HFRI Equity Hedge Index consists of Investment Managers who maintain positions both long and short in primarily equity and equity derivative securities. One cannot invest directly in an index.

- a. Total Gross Exposure is an estimate of a portfolio's exposure to all market activity (up or down markets). By finding the absolute value of our long and short exposure, one finds that 97.7% of MQR's capital is exposed to market fluctuations.
- b. Total net exposure is an estimate of a portfolio's exposure to directional moves in the market. So while 97.7% of the portfolio is expected to move with market movements in either direction (total gross exposure) we would expect our portfolio to move 86.7% (net exposure) in the same direction as the market (ceteris paribus).
- c. Total Gross Shorts (II) are not included in "Total Portfolio" as sale proceeds from the short sale are used to collateralize the position.
